A LETTER FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Dear Friends,

I want to thank you for the strong use of Food and Beverage at the club over the past several months. We have been very busy throughout this time in both banquets and in the dining areas. Now the pool will begin to have more usage and we hope to see more members take advantage of the newly shaded areas under the Pergola. I continue to be surprised at the turnout we experience on Sundays for the Breakfast Buffet. But let's be honest, at only \$7 per person it really is a terrific member perk. The evolution of this member benefit began back when I first started here and relatively few people were attending the Sunday breakfast. Then on some days we found ourselves overwhelmed and unable to provide satisfactory and timely food or service to our members. We struggled with pricing and being competitive to the other choices available in the area. Ultimately we came up with the current solution of a nice variety of breads, fruit, waffles with toppings, a fresh omelet/egg station, with breakfast meat and potatoes to finish it off. Again a great value at only \$7 and we have heard the membership respond by consistently averaging 150 to 225 attendees each Sunday.

With the increasing number there have been growing pains as well. Part of that comes from the occasionally overwhelming volume and the logistics of the omelet station. Lately we have had significant parties of well over 12 people dropping in or making reservations for the buffet and this creates long lines and a lower level of service for everyone. While we encourage you to bring guests and make reservations for Sunday, we are going to change our policy to refer groups larger than 12 to our catering department and those that are larger than 15 to plan a separate set menu instead of using the buffet. Large walk-ins will be seated as space is available, but we strongly suggest calling at least a day ahead. As I said, one reason for this is the inconvenience large par-

ties create for other members enjoying the buffet. However I want to also stress that while we are happy to serve your guests, the special pricing associated with the buffet is truly a member perk and it's not sustainable to larger banquet style events. Again in those cases we will handle the party as a special event with planned menus and separate staffing to ensure the best possible experience for everyone. These adjustments will help to ensure continuation of the breakfast buffet at the current pricing and service levels. I welcome your comments or concerns on any part of this policy, so please contact me directly to address your specific needs.

After some getting some feedback through the committees and in the interest of addressing current needs I have decided to extend lunch menu service on Sunday to 6:00 pm. This extension will be available both on the pool deck and also in the grill. My hope is that members will take advantage of these extended hours and utilize both areas on Sundays. At this time my intention is to explore the reaction and use over the next 3 months and then re-evaluate to determine if it is a good fit for the Club.

Golfer Tip of the Month: "Learn From Your Flight"

We are in the technology age and computers are taking over some teaching in golf. Teaching software is a great tool to using during a lesson. It can show both the student and teacher exactly what is taking place during the swing. However, it is important that every golfer knows how to self-diagnose without the help of technology. This becomes extremely important when practicing.

You can learn everything about your swing by watching your ball flight. One of the most important positions during the swing is at impact. This position will tell you where the ball will start and where the ball will end up. There are 9 ball flight laws in golf. They cover the relationship between the path of the club and the clubface angle. The direction of where the ball starts will tell you your swing path. Where the ball ends up (curves) tells you your face angle.

| 9..... | Outside Path / Closed Face | = Pull Draw or Hook |

Your ball flight will match one of the above characteristics. Fixing the problem is a lot easier when you know the cause. The most important thing you can do is make sure you are properly aligned. Knowing your swing path will not happen without having a specific target.

Please feel free to ask Steve or myself for a quick tip to get your desired ball flight. If you still need help we will be more than willing to go out to range and work with you.

As you approach the green please exit the fairway on the side of the cart path when you reach these stakes.

Rule of the Month

Rule 19 Ball in Motion Deflected or Stopped

This has happened many times here at Oceanside involving our feathered friends. The question came up a couple of months ago involving a ball hitting a duck and then going into the hazard. The rule reads that if a player's ball is accidentally deflected or stopped by an outside agency, it is rub of the green, there is no penalty and the ball must be played as it lies.

The USGA decisions book uses a dog as an example. There are two situations this particular part of the rule covers.

1. If a player is off the green, playing a shot, and the ball is deflected by the dog, the player must play the ball as it lies from its new position. If the dog were to pick the ball up, the player may drop the ball or replace the ball as near as possible to the original position depending if the ball was deflected off or on the green.
2. If the player is on the putting green making a stroke and, while the ball is still in motion, is picked up or deflected by the dog, the stroke is cancelled. The ball must be replaced and replayed.

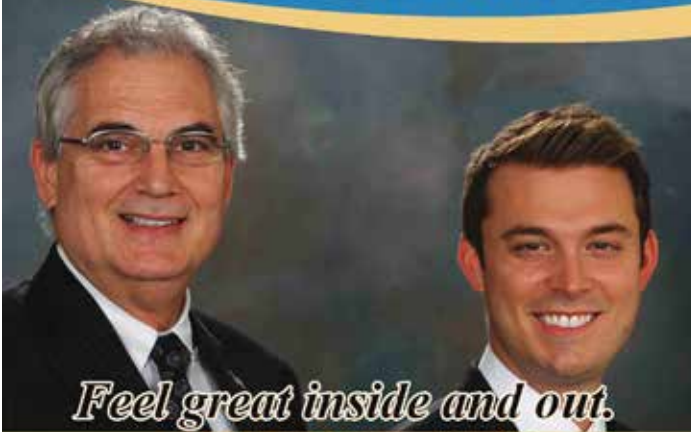

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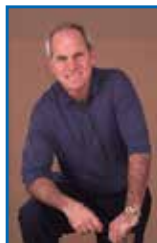
