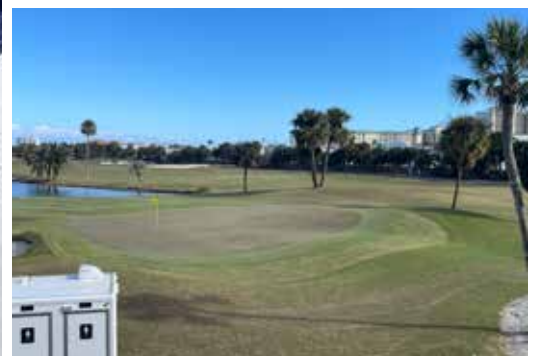

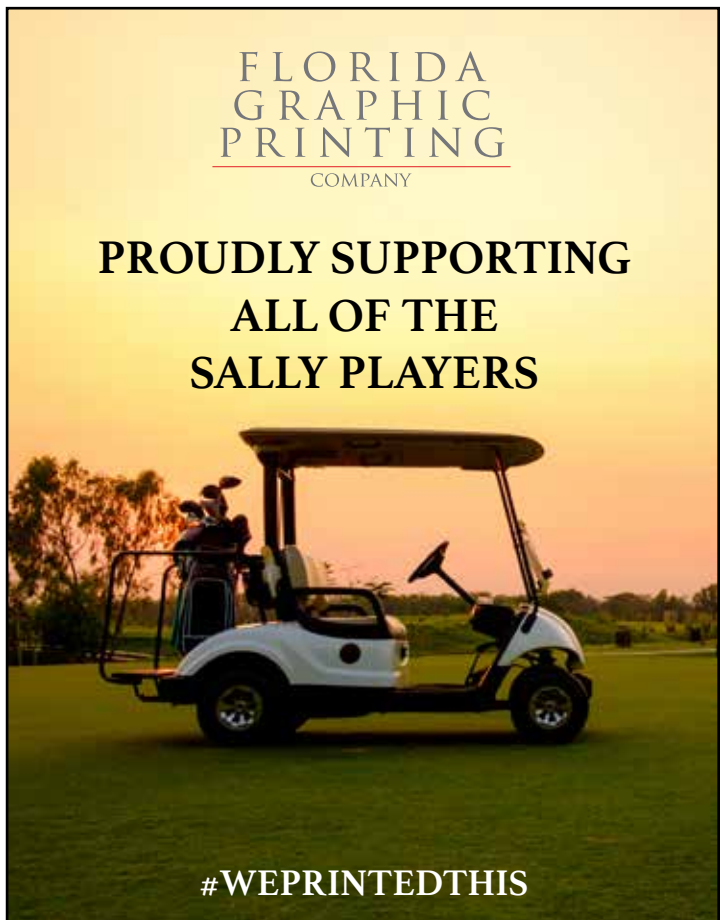

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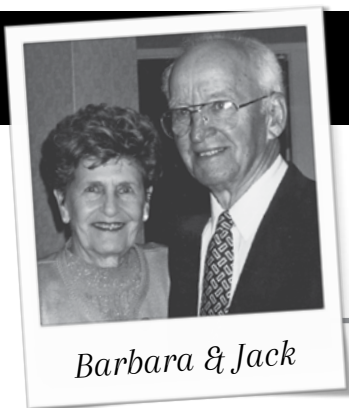

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THE HISTORICAL SIDE OF SALLY

The Roaring Twenties to the new millennium!

For more than two generations a never-ending parade of women golfers has come to the Oceanside Country Club and teed it up in the SALLY. It's a time for recalling rivalries and renewing friendships at an outstanding sporting event and social highlight.

From modest beginnings as a tourist attraction, the SALLY has grown to national, even international prominence. Competitors from numerous states coast-to-coast, and invariably a strong group from the British Isles, Ireland and the European continent share the spotlight.

How the South Atlantic Women's Amateur Golf Championship came to be known informally as the SALLY is shrouded in mystery. But the name endured for decades. Today, in golf's richest era, the Ormond Beach classic overlooking the Atlantic remains one of the nation's oldest tournaments, surely the oldest at a continuous site. It has been played annually in every kind of weather imaginable since 1926 except for the World War II years, 1943-1945, and also 1946. Contested first at match play, the format shifted to stroke (medal) play in 1974.

Seeds of the SALLY were planted when Henry M. Flagler organized the Florida East Coast Railroad in 1886. This railroad pioneer (1830-1913) extended the railroad to Miami, later across water and islands to Key West. As the railroad flourished Flagler built resort hotels along the railroad's route. He bought the Hotel Ormond, a structure started by John Anderson and J.D. Price. Flagler also built a railroad bridge across the Halifax River so famous guests could be deposited on the hotel doorstep. One such guest was John D. Rockefeller, the oil tycoon and philanthropist. Eventually Rockefeller bought the Huntington House across Granada from the Hotel Ormond. He named it the Casements. It was his winter home until his death in 1937 at age 97.

In 1911 the Hotel Ormond Golf and Country Club was built. It featured a spacious clubhouse with wide verandas on the ocean-front. Vacationers were provided every conceivable luxury. The winter retreat business grew rapidly. Hotel owners sponsored women's amateur golf tournaments, an effective stimulant to arouse and heighten interest among guests. Through Rockefeller's influence the Hotel Ormond tourney followed.

In the early days a public relations agency promoted and conducted the hotel tournaments which not only attracted visitors but brought untold publicity to the areas involved. By 1948 the Daytona Beach Chamber of Commerce backed the newly-formed Ormond Beach Golf Association which began running

the South Atlantic championship. Soon a new golf clubhouse replaced the old one.

By 1951 the Hotel Ormond was sold. At the same time, Merrill Ellinor purchased the 185-acre golf course and clubhouse. A Floridian, Ellinor developed Ellinor Village which bears his name. He renamed the golf course the Ellinor Village Country Club. He enhanced the layout and continued the SALLY as a major winter attraction. Late in 1962 Ellinor sold the golf property to the Oceanside Country Club. This organization, with its vital volunteers, club members and club staff, has operated the SALLY for nearly four decades. Now the SALLY, the Harder Hall Invitational (Sebring), the Ione Jones/Doherty Cup (Fort Lauderdale) and the International Four-Ball (Hollywood, FL) comprise the well-known Florida Orange Blossom Circuit.

The first SALLY champion was Dorothy Klotz, a tall, 22-year-old from Chicago who didn't start golf until her second high school year. Her greatest moment came in the semifinals when she beat Glenna Collett (later Mrs. Vare), the reigning U.S. Women's Amateur champion. Klotz successfully defended in 1927, then as Mrs. H. Austin Pardue.

Mary Kendall Browne, a renowned tennis champion, and Dorothy Campbell Hurd of Scot-

land, an American and British golf titleholder, came to the South Atlantic. Chicago's Virginia Van Wie won her fourth SALLY in 1934. She was several times a U.S. Amateur champion.

In the late thirties Patty Berg, a chubby, freckle-faced redhead from Minnesota won back-to-back honors. One of golf's first ambassadors of good will, she turned professional in 1940. Berg was the first president of the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA), the first U.S. Women's Open champion in 1946 and won more than 80 pro and amateur tournaments.

Betty Hicks, Jane Cothran and Georgia Tainter, the Fargo, ND flash, were other pre-war winners. After a wartime hiatus, the 1947 SALLY was won by Mildred "Babe" Didrikson Zaharias. An aggressive competitive fire with brash showmanship and a wonderful sense of humor, the famed Babe never doubted she could beat anybody. She gained acclaim in the 1932 Olympics and won U.S. Opens by wide margins. She died of cancer in 1956 at 42.

Barbara Romack, a 19-year-old golf glamour girl from California won consecutive titles in the early 1950's. Pat Lesser and Ann Quast continued the West Coast dominance for the next few years. Lesser was so good she played on the men's golf team at Seattle University. Quast won the U.S. Amateur several years. Champions Barbara McIntire of Ohio, Doris Phillips of

Illinois and tiny Clifford Ann Creed of Louisiana got the 1960's going. The 1963 SALLY started a seven-year run by Phyllis "Tish" Preuss in which she won five titles. The petite blonde from Pompano Beach was a superb putter and wedge wizard. She won all four events on the Florida winter trail. Her

string was interrupted by Barbara Fay White, the daughter of a Louisiana golf professional and Sandra Post, a flaxen-haired Canadian junior champ. Post was the first non-American winner and soon after became a leading professional.

Lancy Smith, from the Buffalo, NY suburb of Snyder, blew into prominence in 1966 at the age of 18 when she won the Empire State Amateur. She won four SALLY titles in the 1970's and again in 1985. In 1989 at the age of 41 she captured her sixth title, a record. She is the only SALLY champion to win both match and stroke play honors.

Carol Semple, an outstanding career amateur, gained signal honors at home and abroad, winning the 1973 U.S. Amateur and the British Amateur the following year. By winning the latter she joined a handful of Americans who won that crown. Three of them, Babe Zaharias, Barbara McIntire and Ann (Quast) Welts were SALLY champions. Many times Pennsylvania Amateur champion, Carol (Semple) Thompson won other U.S. and regional tournaments. She has been a Curtis Cup team member a record number of times. Carol's mother, Phyllis, competed in the SALLY until the 1970's. In 1971 she gave her daughter a quarterfinal lesson, the only such match in SALLY history.

The initial stroke play championship in 1974 went to Debbie Massey, a 23-year-old frosty blonde from Pennsylvania. Cynthia "Cindy" Hill was a double champion. Pat (Roy) Meyers outdistanced the 1976 field. The weather was insufferable but the Ormond Beach golfer hung on and triumphed by five. She later turned professional.

Lisa Stanley was a 17-year-old high school senior from Melbourne, FL when she won in 1982.

Ireland's Claire Hourihane survived a stiff Atlantic wind and low temperatures to become the first foreign winner in 1983. Wild winds were no problem for Claire Waite of Marlborough, England, a foreign winner a second straight year.

The winner of the 1984 Championship "B" Flight was Alison Nicholas of Yorkshire, England. Thirteen years later she won the U.S. Open by a stroke over Nancy Lopez. Fans also recall Nancy Hager, Debbie Raso, Sherrie Ann Keblish, Pat Rizzo, Leslie Shannon, Cindy Scholefield and Caroline Keggi as champions in the seventies and eighties.

As the nineties unfolded, the gifted amateur in general and the college player in particular, took center stage. Some of the champions of that time sought fame and fortune on the professional tour: Katie Peterson, Vicki Goetze, Debbi Koyama, Cristie Kerr, Grace Park, Kellee Booth and Beth Bauer, the 2000 winner who set a new scoring record of 285. Marla Jemsek-Weeks, Vicki Thomas and Virginia Derby Grimes stayed on the amateur circuit.

Of special note is Ceil Maclaren of Savannah, GA, now in her seventies. She won 14 senior medalist trophies since the start of that event in 1978. But one of the saddest stories of the SALLY is that of Marge Burns of Greensboro, NC. Marge entered the SALLY in 1950 and called it quits 20 years later. She was four times a finalist, nine times a semi-finalist, three times a medalist but never a champion.

All the golfing thrills over the years by the champions, near-champions and the scores of others with varying talents who gave it their best shot left the Ormond Beach and Daytona Beach areas with a rich and lasting legacy.

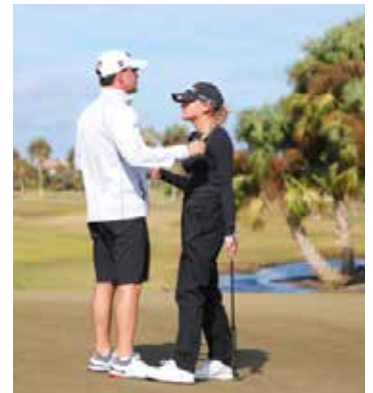
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
